## **Lago de Diablo es muy bonito!**

Our September Campout to Devil's Lake near Baraboo, Wisconsin was absolutely fantastic. Did you miss it? Were you there? Read on and see how great it was...

The troop waded into back-to-back traffic with everyone else heading west on Route 120 during rush hour. Wow, it took us over 15 minutes just to get past Hainesville Road. Ouch, at this pace, the GPS said we'd be there at 4AM! Fortunately, traffic cleared out nicely and we were soon heading north at the speed limit. Whew, the GPS drops to a 9 PM arrival.

Through our keen sense of dead reckoning, we all arrived at the ranger station at Mirror Lake within minutes of each other - even though our five vehicles traveled three different routes.

Under star-lit skies, we unloaded our gear from the parking lot and hauled it on wagons and shoulders to our campsite just under a quarter mile from the lot. It wasn't long before we enjoyed our cracker-barrel snack and held a quick PLC meeting to plan our Saturday activities.




Saturday dawned clear and cool. Mr. Wehde and Mr. Cambio were up and out at first light to head to Devil's Lake to set up the climbing pitches. The troop cooked up breakfast in the patrols (surprisingly, each patrol and the adults all chose to make pancakes). And it's a good thing, too. We were on a tight schedule to meet our "Troop's Climbing Guru" at the parking lot by 9am.

It wasn't long before we were hauling climbing gear up the hill. Mr. Wehde had selected the routes the Scouts

would use and they looked great. He explained how to set 'em up safe and showed the Scouts what they needed to do to climb safely. It's a good thing the troop practiced their climbing knots to be ready for this trip.

Soon the climbers were 'on the ropes' but in a good way. Scouts had a chance to climb and help belay each other using different routes up the rock face.

As the climbers were getting warmed up, another group left to hike the trails that meander through this amazing park. Led by Mr. Mack who has hiked these trails and knew the best routes, we drove to the far end of the park to hike Parfrey's Glen. I have to say, I was not prepared for this beautiful trail. Hiking upstream along small creek, we could see that we were going back into geologic time. There were layers of sedimentary rock and layers of conglomerate. We could see how the area had once been an inland sea only to be buried under miles of ice in at least two glacial periods. Near the end of the canyon, a small waterfall pours from the creek to continue the process of wearing away the rock and making the canyon ever deeper.

Both groups took a break to enjoy their lunch under sunny skies, temps about 68 degrees and calm winds. We joined up again briefly to see how everyone was doing, then split up again. By 5 o'clock, we were all back in the parking lot and ready to return to camp. We were hungry and a bit tired, but happy from a great day in the woods and on the rocks. It couldn't have been better.

Dinner always takes longer when you don't have a microwave oven to zap it, so we settled in to cook over charcoal using grills and Dutch Ovens. And, oh my, what creations we made: One patrol outdid themselves and prepared Bacon-wrapped steak and salad, while the other patrol went the easy route with Dorito-style tacos. The adults had grilled steaks, a special Wehde-style Mac n' Cheese and salad. These meals hit the spot. If you get the chance, ask Mr. Ostick how to make cobbler...

Nick B, acting SPL, called the troop together for a late but quick campfire. During our Rose-Bud-Thorn discussion, it was interesting to hear how much of an impact the day's climbing had on several Scouts. To take the first step over the cliff and rappel down the side requires personal confidence as well as trust in your fellows and your gear. Congratulations to everyone who conquered their fears at Lago de Diablo.

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### House of Peace Eagle Service Project – “The Store”

This summer, Nathan T completed work on a second large-scale service project for the House of Peace Women's Shelter, located in Northern Lake County. The House of Peace program provides a safe and dignified environment for women and children to escape abuse and end long cycles of domestic violence. Over 200 community volunteers have worked with this program since its opening in 2009; with the single goal of enabling these individuals to restart their lives with dignity and security.

Over the course of nearly a year, Nathan worked with Mrs. Torkelson (Mrs. T) who runs the newly started, shelter donation program. “The Store” was a long-term goal for the House of Peace to provide a place where residents can receive new and donated goods (housewares, clothing, furniture, toys and sundries) as they begin a new chapter in their lives, outside the shelter.

Mrs. T had a vision: the facility should be clean and organized, like a retail store; a welcoming place where items are labeled and easily located. Through the Fr. Gary Graf Center, Mrs. T had the makings of a new store, located in an unused 20x25 classroom. Tables were donated for displaying merchandise but the



sheer amount of goods that flooded in overwhelmed the modest early setup. Mrs. T reached out to Troop 96 for help.

Armed with room measurements and a drawing, Nathan pitched his idea to provide shelving units, garment racks, bi-lingual signs and to inventory the donated supplies to move Mrs. T's vision forward, as an Eagle service project, for 2013. Through many meetings and discussions on needs, a final plan was agreed upon in November and the project was approved by Troop 96 and NEIC Council in January.

Funding the cost of the store was a challenge, estimated to be about \$3500 in materials. A campaign to seek private donations and working with several local building-supply retailers was started immediately. Through retailer donations, the real cost of materials was brought down to a manageable \$1500. Exceptionally generous donations from the Knights of Columbus (Troop96's charter and sponsor organization) and friends of Troop 96, quickly closed the funding needs and work was started in March.

Mrs. T asked Nathan to build and deliver units, over time, so the room could take shape gradually and the staff could best figure out how to use the new storage space. Completed units were delivered to the new store between March and June, about one to two per month.



After 8 months, nearly 500 working hours across 25 scout volunteers and families, "the Store" was completed.


